Single Tickets Now Available for Kentucky Opera's 23/24 Season

The season opens in September with Hansel and Gretel, a darkly delightful fairy-tale opera featuring a standout cast and Youth Chorus

Registration is open for Youth Opera Project.

Programming centered around Hansel and Gretel explores food insecurity, a theme from the opera.

Louisville, KY — Kentucky Opera announced today that single tickets are now available for its entire 23/24 Season, which opens on September 29 with Engelbert Humperdinck's whimsical Hansel and Gretel.

For the first time in 13 years, Kentucky Opera brings this larger-than-life fairy-tale to Louisville in a production sure to enchant audiences and provoke thoughtful conversation about timeless issues, like poverty and food scarcity, good and evil.

Brenna Corner, who delighted audiences with last season's Cinderella (*La Cenerentola*), returns to direct her colorful and evocative production of this opera. Featured are mezzo-soprano Naomi O'Connell as Hansel, soprano Ashley Emerson as Gretel, mezzo-soprano Stephanie Sanchez (Welch Family Endowed Artist) as the Witch, soprano Angelique Clay as Gertrude the mother, and soprano Marquita Richardson as Sandman/Dew Fairy. Baritone Chad Sloan is Peter, the father. Kelly Kuo, noted nationally for his commitment to bold and creative initiatives, conducts.

Hansel and Gretel runs September 29 and October 1 & 3. Families and groups are encouraged to come out for a special Family Day Matinée – with special activities during intermission and group and family ticket discounts – on October 3 during Fall Break for many area schools.

YOUTH OPERA PROJECT AUDITIONS

Hansel and Gretel also features Kentucky Opera's Youth Opera Project, a season-long program dedicated to fostering discovery, opportunity, and friendships in the performing arts for youth ages 8-18.

This year, the Youth Opera Project will perform own youth opera: *The Hobbit*. Registration is now open for the Youth Opera Project, which meets weekly on Mondays after school with some additional rehearsals closer to performances. The next audition date for youth wishing to sing solo roles in *The* Hobbit will be held on August 26 at the Kentucky Opera Center for Cultural Health, 708 Magazine Street. Children and youth ages 8-18 are invited to audition with one song of their choice. No experience necessary, but students must register in advance.

HANSEL AND GRETEL COMMUNITY PROGRAMMING

With every production, Kentucky Opera's <u>Awakenings</u> series invites the public to learn from experts in fields related to an opera's theme. The first Awakenings conversation of the season focuses on poverty and food insecurity. It is September 19, 7 pm, at the Kentucky Opera Center for Cultural Health; Free admission. Speakers to be announced soon.

On September 9, 2023, 7 pm-9 pm, Kentucky Opera also hosts an immersive fundraising event with popup performances, food stations, a chocolate river, gingerbread house, and so much more. Join Hansel and Gretel in their fanciful, <u>Fairytale Woodland</u>, and support the mission of Kentucky Opera. Tickets are \$125 per person or \$100 per person for a group of 10 or more.
